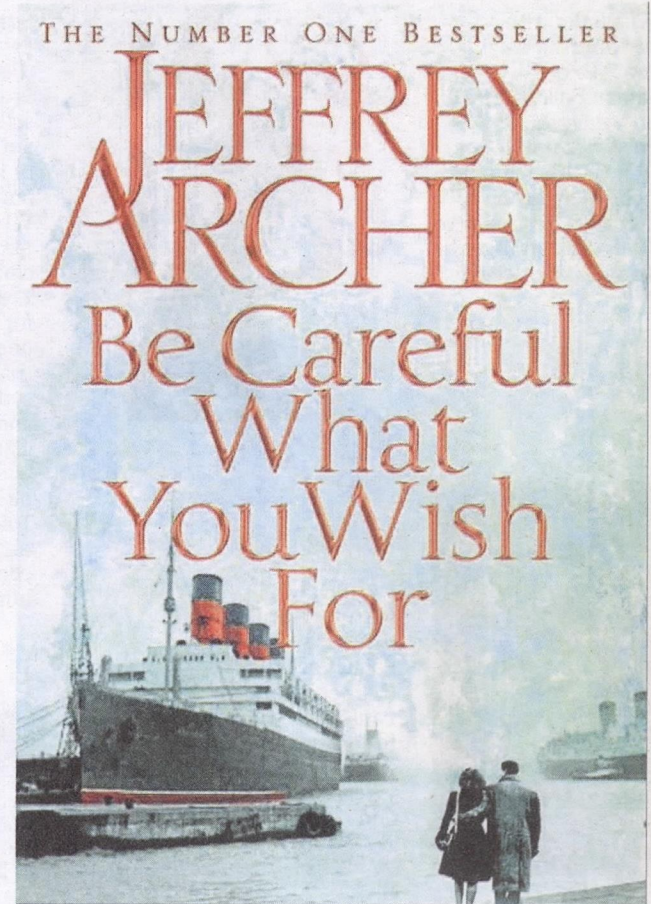
Unlucky 13

In this Women's Murder Club mystery, Detective Lindsay has to face one of the most gruesome crime scenes yet: two people who have died due to a so-called "belly bomb".



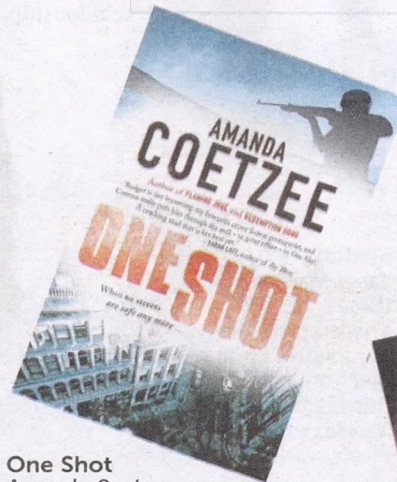
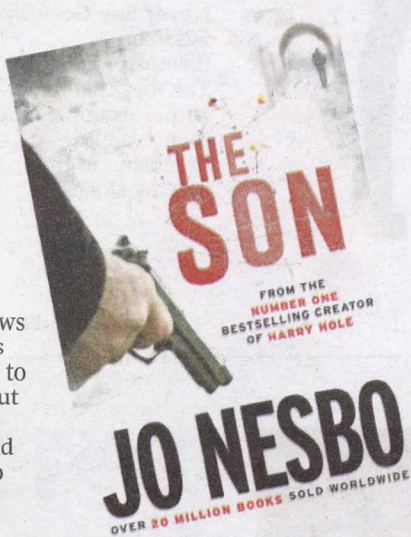
The Girl With A Clock For A Heart

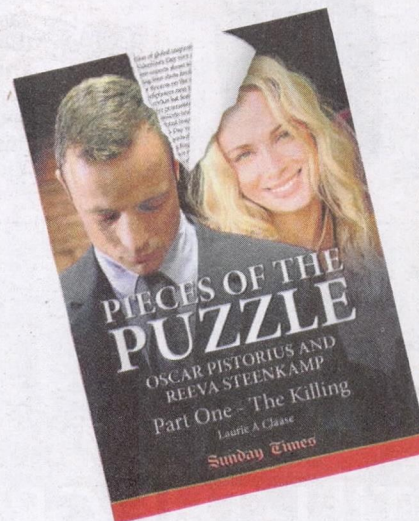
Be Careful What You Wish For
