Mboweni to head council

THE TOURISM Business Council of SA (TBCSA) has elected former SA Reserve Bank governor Tito Mboweni as the chairman of its board of directors. Mboweni will take over the reins from Mavuso Msimang, who served two terms in the position. TBCSA is a member-based organisation, made up of trade associations, as well as leading corporations in the travel and tourism sector, seeking to ensure that the industry is unified and speaks with one voice when engaging stakeholders on issues affecting the sector.
